## REDEVELOPMENT AGENCY BUDGET UPDATE

As the City of San José is preparing the Fiscal Year 2009-2010 Budget, I wanted to take this opportunity to keep our residents up-to-date on the budget outlook for the San José Redevelopment Agency. As many of you are aware, the FY 2009-2010 Budget includes cuts, shifts, and captures billions of dollars in local funding from cities and counties in order to address the State's deficit. Immediate State Budget includes the State's borrowing of \$20 million from property taxes. The State plans to take from the Redevelopment Agency \$62 million this year and \$13 million next year, in addition to a \$13 million that the Legislature approved in 2008 to reallocate from Redevelopment and into State funding, for a total of \$88 million.

The City of San José continues to face significant fiscal challenges. Unfortunately, faced with the major impact to their budget and the downturn of the economy, the Redevelopment Agency recently had to lay off 24 of its staff, which is roughly 24% of the Agency, and eliminate funding for one additional position and placed many of its projects on hold.

On October 26, 2009, the Redevelopment Agency will be releasing the FY 2009-2010 Proposed Operating and Capital Budget and FY 2009-2013 Five Year Capital Improvement Project Budget. A public hearing regarding the proposed Redevelopment Agency's proposed budget will take place on Tuesday, November 10, 2009 at 7:00 p.m. in the Council Chambers. The Redevelopment Agency is expected to review and adopt the Mayor's Redevelopment Agency Budget Message on December 8, 2009 and adopt the budget on December 15, 2009.

Redevelopment is a tool for stimulating economic development by eliminating blight and revitalizing neighborhoods in the 21 Project Areas throughout San Jose. In District 4, Redevelopment funds are generally used for industrial development in North San José. By using this tool wisely, we have and can continue to encourage new development and private investments, and generate jobs and tax revenues.

## OLD BERRYESSA LIBRARY UPDATE



First and foremost, I would like to thank you all for your patience regarding the re-use of the Old Berryessa Library. As you may already know, the City Council approved the authorization of staff to conduct an exclusive 90 day negotiation period with East Side Union High School District (ESUHSD) for a lease agreement for the former Berryessa Library building in December 2008. The City has continued negotiations with ESUHSD past the 90 day timeline but unfortunately, negotiations came to a halt over the summer due to the budget realities the school district was facing.

Conceptually, staff from ESUHSD and the City have agreed to lease the vacant building to ESUHSD under City Council Policy 7-1 (below market lease, i.e. \$1/mo.). Because the building is on park land, the City can only enter into a contract of 3 years, with the option of renewal. As part of the agreement, ESUHSD would incur the costs for the rehabilitation of the building. In addition, ESUHSD would have needed to remediate mold infestation, bring building to code (health, safety, ADA), and do tenant improvements necessary to accommodate their programmatic needs.

Given the recent budget constraints of ESUHSD and the monetary investment needed at the start, it proved to be difficult for ESUHSD to make a commitment at this time. Moreover, it has remained difficult to find a tenant who was willing to make such a large investment without a guarantee of a lease period longer than 3 years.

I have met with the City staff regarding next steps and have agreed it was in the best interest to demolish the old Berryessa Library and expand the parking lot. I understand that this vacant building has been an ongoing eyesore in the community for the past few years and I believe that the expansion of the parking lot will better serve the increasing needs of the visitors at the Berryessa Branch Library.

**A community meeting is planned for October 28 at 6:30PM at the Berryessa Branch Library** to inform the community of the City's decision and to provide a timeline for the demolition and construction.

I want to thank all the community panel members for their time and assistance during the Request for Proposal (RFP) selection process as well as the residents for their input and feedback. ## SAN JOSE GOES SOLAR EVENT AT ALVISO LIBRARY A SUCCESS!

On September 19, the San José Goes Solar kick off event was held at the Alviso Branch Library with nearly 100 people in attendance. This event celebrated the installation of 6 solar power systems (20 kW) on City buildings in low and moderate income neighborhoods, with the Alviso Library being the first of the six to go green. This project advances 2 of the City's Green Vision goals to reduce per capita energy use by 50% and receive 100% of San José's electrical power from clean renewable sources by 2022. The projects were funded by the City's Community Development Block Grant in support of the City's Green Vision goals to reduce energy consumption and increase use of renewable technologies. ## ABANDONED BOATS IN ALVISO REMOVED

Abandoned boats can be a continuous source of hazardous pollutants. They sink and pollute our waterways endangering habitat, wildlife, drinking water, and recreational boaters. Toxic chemicals from boats can be consumed by people who eat fish out of the bay. 5 abandoned boats have been sitting in the Alviso Marina for a varied length of time, but with some stranded for as long as 30 years.

Removing abandoned boats can be very costly. Just one sunken sailboat can cost upwards of \$12,000. With nearly one million registered boats in use, California is the second largest boating state in the nation and spends about \$500,000 each year to remove deserted recreational boats from our marinas and water ways.

Abandoned boats have been an ongoing eyesore to the Alviso community. I am happy to inform you that the South Bay Yacht Club has recently completed a project to remove these boats from the Marina. There was no funding available for this; the South Bay Yacht Club used their savings to remove the abandoned boats. The South Bay Yacht Club also repaired the dock and made all repairs with the environment's sensitive ecosystem in mind, taking the necessary precautions to not disturb the Marina. The South Bay Yacht Club has been an important fixture in our Alviso community and on behalf of the District 4 community, I would like to convey our many thanks and appreciation for your work in beautifying our community.

Moving forward, a Santa Clara County ordinance has been proposed as a mediation step, particularly for Alviso. My office is working closely with County Supervisor Dave Cortese office and Water District staff to work on the ordinance development. In the meantime, please contact my office if you have any questions or comments.

## COMMUNITY & DEVELOPMENT UPDATES

### PIEDMONT/HOSTETTER STREETLIGHT

Having safe neighborhoods continue to be a priority throughout the City of San José. There has been substantial progress to improve our road networks in Berryessa. Many had contacted my office to express concerns regarding the intersection of Piedmont Road and Hostetter Road. I am happy to inform you that the traffic signal has been installed at this intersection and was activated on September 16, 2009.



### MABURY/COMMODORE PARK STATUS

As part of the Fiscal Year 2009-2010 budget process, City Council has deferred the opening of 3 park projects to help offset the General Fund impacts, which is anticipated to have impacts of new Parks operated facilities in 2010-2011 of \$1.6 million and in 2011-2012 of \$2.3 million. To ensure the City is able to maintain and operate the new facilities that are currently funded, all projects not yet under construction have been analyzed to determine if accelerating or decelerating them would help the City's financial sustainability in the near future.

With the current economic climate, the cost of constructing and maintain the park are crucial points to consider. Unfortunately, after analyzing all fully funded Parks project not yet under construction, the Mabury Park was recommended for deferral. Despite this, the planned Park remains a priority for me and I will continue to work with staff to ensure completion.

### KING BRIDGE WIDENING EFFORTS

The widening of the King Road Bridge remains a high priority for the City of San José. Unfortunately, there is not a feasible way to construct the bridge independent of a comprehensive project for a flood control improvement along Penitencia Creek between Coyote Creek and Dorel Drive. Because the existing bridge constrains flow along the river, removing or replacing it, without downstream creek channel improvements, would create flooding issues for an existing neighborhood west of King Road.

Since 2003, the Corps of Engineers has been in a process with various environmental regulatory agencies to determine their preferred alternative for the creek design. The Water District has the Upper Penitencia Creek project funded in their Capital Improvement Program, but only through their 2011 Fiscal Year, and only for the Planning Phase. After that, the project will only move forward once the Federal Government funds this Corps project.

Once the channel improvements are funded, the City can move forward with the revised bridge design so that the construction can occur concurrently. The Santa Clara Valley Water District (SCVWD) has been willing to participate in the cost of the bridge reconstruction, and the City will also apply for Federal Highway Bridge Replacement grant to help reduce the City's cost.

In the past few months, I have met with our State lobbyists and Federal lobbyists regarding the widening of the King Road Bridge and asked for their assistance in advocating for State and Federal funding to support the completion of this project. I will provide another update once more information becomes available.


